The Yukon-Koyukuk School District is planning its Fall Child Find activities. Members of the community will be able to take advantage of special education services for their eligible children who are between the ages of 3 and 21 years and disabled. The Child Find process serves as a screening to identify those children who may benefit from a special education referral. This is a free and confidential service.

Children who demonstrate the following disabilities could be eligible for special education support:

Autism
Deafness
Deaf-Blindness
Cognitive Impairment
Emotional Disturbance
Hearing Impairment
Specific Learning Disability
Multiple Disabilities
Orthopedic Impairment
Other Health Impairment
Early Childhood Developmental Delay
Speech or Language Impairment
Traumatic Brain Injury
Visual Impairment

Public schools are required to provide students with disabilities a "free and appropriate public education" (FAPE) beginning at age 3 years. This includes services from physical, occupational, psychological and speech therapists, if it is determined that the child is eligible for such service as defined by the Yukon-Koyukuk School District and State of Alaska eligibility criteria. A team of trained professionals will assist you in determining if a disability prevents your child from being successful in the preschool or regular educational environment because of a deficit skill in vision, listening/hearing, reading, speaking, writing, understanding, attention, communication, etc.
